



Over the past two weeks over half of parents reported that they felt either moderately or very anxious.


Family support

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Over two thirds of parents stated that they often or almost always felt their family actively supported each other.




Parental sadness



Over the past two weeks 42% of parents reported that they felt either moderately or very depressed.

A high proportion of parents report feeling quite a lot or a great deal stressed about their child's well-being, behaviour, education and loss of usual support system.
